NETWORKS AND WHOLES

- Cultures are a network of "meanings, practices, and values that allow one to grasp [...] life."
- Networks are not fully self-sustained

- Society is both organized and disorganized by the clashing of networks
- Overlapping networks impact the system in which they exist

NETWORKS IN ACTION

- Overlapping networks essentially collapsed America's early postal system
- It also obstructed print culture
